There is a lot that gets in the way of people with disabilities having a good life. People say they have problems getting out of the house, travelling about, problems with care and support and even the way people speak to people with disabilities.

Here are **four things** that future MPs could take action on:



Act urgently to make social care about the right to have a good life. This means providing more funding and having better system of social care at a national level.



Disabled people want to see better access to public spaces, buildings and transport. New laws could be put into place to help this happen.



Challenge people's views and raise awareness so people with different disabilities can get the support they need, including into work.



Support the NHS plan to bring sight tests into England's special schools, as well as improving eye care for children and adults with learning disabilities and autism.



Let's make inclusion a reality – that includes making sure this election is accessible to everyone!
