To take part in Game for Change you need to follow some rules.



This is called a code of conduct.



It makes sure that everyone stays safe and has fun.

Staying safe online



We want you to stay safe when you play games online.



It is best to play games online with people that you already know.



If you meet someone new online it is good to be careful.



But some people may not be who they say they are.



Do not say anything too personal about yourself.



Like your full name or address.



If someone is asking you personal questions you should tell a parent or supporter.



If someone is asking you for money you should tell a parent or supporter.



If you ever feel uncomfortable you should tell a parent or supporter.

It might not be safe to meet with a person you have met online.



If you do meet someone in person you should bring a supporter with you.

Taking care of yourself



Playing games online can be really fun.



It is important to take lots of breaks when you are playing games.



Try to take a break every 45 minutes.



Make sure you drink lots of water.



And eat regular meals.



If you are tired or not enjoying playing, it is okay to stop.



You do not need to keep playing if you do not want to.



Even if you are raising money for SeeAbility!



We just want you to have a good time.

The behaviour we expect



When you are streaming a game for SeeAbility there are some rules you need to follow.



1. Have fun! If you are not having fun you do not need to keep playing.



2. Be kind to anyone who talks to you while you are streaming.



3. Do not use any rude or inappropriate words.



4. Do not share any rude or inappropriate pictures.



5. Make sure you follow the rules that the streaming company give, like Twitch.



6. If you see any unkind behaviour, it is important to let someone know.



7. Talk about SeeAbility in a positive way.
