People use the internet for lots of different things.



It is a good way to keep in touch with people you know.



But it is important to use the internet carefully.



You should follow these rules to keep safe.



Do not give out personal information about yourself.



Do not give out your full name or address.



Only share photos with people that you know.



Never tell people your bank details.



Keep all your passwords secret.



Some people may not be who they say they are.



Be careful if you get an email or message from someone you do not know.



Do not click on any links in emails from people or companies that you do not know.



Be careful speaking to people you do not know on the internet.



Always talk to your parent or supporter before speaking a new person on the internet.



Do not meet up alone with a person you have met on the internet.



You should tell a parent or supporter if:

 Someone is making you feel sad or uncomfortable



 Someone is asking you personal questions



 Someone is asking you for money or your bank details



Someone is asking for your passwords
