SeeAbility has been chosen by Surrey County Council as the ongoing care partner for its purpose-built supported living developments in Byfleet. Both sites will support higher-need autistic adults or those with a learning disability, some of whom may have further physical or sensory needs.

SeeAbility has a strong heritage – in fact they're one of the oldest disability charities in the UK. They've pioneered specialist support for over 225 years and are passionate about supporting people with disabilities to achieve their goals and live inclusive lives in local communities.

At the heart of their work is supporting people to live ambitious and fulfilling lives. Whether that's forming more friendships and relationships, trying new experiences, or finding paid employment, they're committed to creating opportunities for people with learning disabilities, autism and sight loss.

Their committed team of specialists work alongside our support teams, providing a unique combination of positive behaviour support and vision rehabilitation expertise in supported living accommodation and residential homes located across the south of England.

They have been supporting people in Surrey since the early 1900s and are excited to support people to shape ambitious lives in their new homes in Byfleet.

Accommodation

Nestled between the bustle of the London commuter belt and the Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, the new homes in Byfleet bring the best of both town and country.

The accommodation in Byfleet can house up to 16 people:

- One apartment block with six self-contained 1-bedroom flats
- Two townhouses, each with five bedrooms and shared kitchens and communal areas



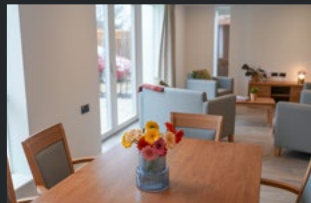
We know that some people with learning disabilities or autism may express themselves in ways that can be noisy, so all the buildings have additional sound insulation to allow people to be themselves without worrying about neighbours.

Each of the buildings also has extensive landscaped grounds, giving everyone the chance to enjoy the outdoors with privacy.

Finding community in Byfleet

SeeAbility are always supporting people to put down roots and feel at home in their local area.

Byfleet is an attractive village on the banks of the River Wey in Surrey. Just south of London, it offers easy access to the excitement of London, while having its own small, community feel. Its proximity to Woking means that shopping, cafes and entertainment are only a short drive away.



In addition to socialising with flatmates, there are a number of social groups in the local area, such as LinkAble and the Halow Project while the online directory, Connect to Support Surrey can help people to find friends and build skills through other clubs and activities.

There are also SeeAbility-wide programmes that people can get involved with. Their Ready, Willing and Able programme supports people to find paid employment and build careers, and the Listen Up! team brings together people with disabilities to speak up about issues that matter to them.
